
Hello Shipmates,



CHAIRMAN'S REPORT





Welcome Shipmates Family Members & Guest:

It is now time to start preparing for our next reunion, our 23rd in St. Louis, MO. Our tour committee Mary Lou Chartrand, Debbie Weaver, Julia Goricki has been doing research on tours that may be of interest to our shipmates & guest. They have sent me two pages of things to do & see, some are free admission and some not open until Wednesday. They could be done on your own or we could start a 5 hour tour on Wednesday. I have been working on the most popular tours to set up and places to have lunch with a few suggestions. In order to keep the cost down and get the most for your buck, the casino's in the area offer a variety of food at the buffet at a reasonable price. Some of the tour prices are not out until January 2019 but as soon as they are available I will set them up. The Gateway Arch has limitations to accessibility & height problems for some doing the Tram ride to the top. You will have a choice of tours. We will have one Motor Coach with a lift for those needing it for wheelchairs. The motorized carts can be put underneath to give us more room on the bus to accommodate 52-56.The tours will run from 8:30am to 4:30pm Monday, Sept.16, 2019 & Tues. Sept.17, 2019. In order to do the tours we need (40) people or it will be cancelled. When the bus is full (52-56) a waiting list will be established. (Breakfast will start at 6:00am) We could have gone with a tour company to do the tours but you would be paying well over a \$100.00 plus for each tour. The money we save goes back into the treasury and back to the membership in raffle room nights, reduced banquet prices for Welcome Aboard. Each year the food & room rates are going up so we try and keep the cost increase to a couple of dollars. We have a surprise for you at our 2019 reunion at our Banquet Dinner. A Vocalist Entertainer who will be doing a tribute to Frank Sinatra 50/s 60/s dance music, so get your dancing shoes on and I hope you will enjoy the show. Marylou has recommended the entertainer so you will have to give her all the credit, and some from shipmates requesting some entertainment at the Banquet. We try and keep the dates of the reunions around September or October but sometimes we have to change to May or June or even August depending on State location and cost of rooms. I have sent out e-mail Questionnaires for requested reunion location for 2021 and have received back a few with their choice. The three most voted on were Las Vegas-Philadelphia-Branson. If you haven't sent in your choice please do so now if you want your voice heard. Your dues are now do for 2019 so send in your dues, come to a reunion & enjoy the benefits, recruit new members, call a buddy you served with and ask him to come to the reunion. Definition of term:

- Unique visitor Number of client hosts (IP address) who came to visit the site (and who visited at least one page)
- Number of visits A new visitor is defined as each new incoming visitor(viewing or browsing a page)
- Pages- Number of times a page of the site is viewed (sum of all visitors for all visits). This piece of data differs from "Hits" in that it counts only HTLM pages as opposed to images and other files.
- Hits- Number of times a page, image, and file of the site in viewed or downloaded by someone.
