USS POWER HISTORY



Welcome Aboard,

Naval history is full of significant and interesting events. This brief history of what has transpired in the past and relate them to how these events have shaped the U.S. Navy today. USS Power (DD 839), a Gearing-class destroyer was launched on 30 June 1945 by the Bath Iron Works, Bath, Maine; and commissioned on 13 September 1945 at Boston. She was the first Navy ship named for First Lieutenant John V. Power, USMC (1918–1944), who was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for heroism in the Battle of Kwajalein. USS Power served her country for 32 years and 18 days of active, until decommissioned on 1 October 1977.

Besides, on this day:

1815 - In the last naval action of the War of 1812, the sloop of war, USS Peacock, commanded by Capt. Lewis Warrington, comes across the British cruiser HMS Nautilus in the Straits of Sunda. The cruiser's crew informed Capt. Warrington of the Treaty of Ghent. Suspicious, he wants Nautilus to strike colors. Refusing to do so, Peacock broadsides her, killing or wounding 15. Boarding the vessel, Capt. Warrington discovers the treaty is true and releases HMS Nautilus and repairs the Ship.

1942- USS Plunger (SS 179) sinks Japanese freighter No.5 Unkai Maru off the China coast near Shanghai.

1943-In Operation Toenails, Task Force 31, commanded by Rear Adm. Richmond K. Turner, lands the New Georgian Occupation Force, consisting of the U.S. Armys 172nd Infantry, 43rd Division on Rendova Island. Task Force 31 is supported By land-based aircraft and destroyer gunfire. The troops land without opposition.

1945 -USS Baya (SS 318) and USS Capitaine (SS 336) attack the Japanese Makassar to Surabaya convoy MASU 705 and

engage escorting submarine (Ch 5) and later sink cargo vessel Bandai Maru.

1951 - A group of stranded Japanese soldiers who refuse to believe World War II ended in 1945, surrender to Lt. Cmdr. James B. Johnson, USS Cocopa (ATF 101) on Anatahan Island in the northern Marianas.

36 Attended with 15 Shipmates of USS Power in Attendance.



Definition of term:

Unique visitor – Number of client hosts (IP address) who came to visit the site (and who visited at least one page)

Number of visits – A new visitor is defined as each new incoming visitor(viewing or browsing a page)

Pages- Number of times a page of the site is viewed (sum of all visitors for all visits). This piece of data differs from "Hits" in that it counts only HTLM pages as opposed to images and other files.

Hits- Number of times a page, image, and file of the site in viewed or downloaded by someone.

Our website has links for <u>Project Shad 1962-1973</u>, <u>Mesothelioma, and Agent Orange</u>; if you are a Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veteran (Power West Pac Viet Nam cruise from August 1968 to July 1969), you may be eligible for The Veterans Act of 2019 (Public Law 116-23, enacted 01 July 2019). In this law, you may qualify for a presumption of service connection if you have a disease that is recognized as being associated with herbicide exposure. Agent Orange tab has information to reference material that may benefit you in your claim with the VA. Also, note a Facebook link feature on the <u>www.usspowerdd839.org</u> website that will connect you to the USS Power Facebook page, <u>USS Power DD-839</u>. Currently, there are 133 members on the public group site. Check out both sites. Remember, you are free to post on the Facebook page any subject matter related to the USS Power at any time; pictures of your time onboard are always welcome.
